

Celebrating its 60th anniversary this year, the Foundation brings the benefits and resources of the game of golf into the lives of beginners, juniors, individuals with disabilities, minorities and the economically disadvantaged throughout the area served by the CDGA.

The Foundation's "Sunshine Through Golf" program is the largest grass roots golf program for individuals with disabilities in the country.

The Sunshine Course provides the opportunity for our Sunshine Through Golf program and the programs of allied associations dedicated to utilizing golf in an educational, therapeutic, recreational or rehabilitative manner.

Among the participants are physically and developmentally impaired children and adults, including stroke survivors, amputee golfers, individuals with Downs Syndrome and many others.

While golfers play the course, turfgrass research is taking place. The Sunshine Course is the largest living turfgrass facility with playing capacity in Illinois.

There are 24 varieties of grass planted on the practice putting green, different types of sand in each bunker and various types of bentgrass on each tee. The CDGA's turfgrass program grows and develops upon the turf for the benefit of CDGA course superintendents and other agronomists.

The Sunshine Course and surroundings here at Midwest Golf House provide an arboretum of trees, shrubs, flowers and grasses. The land is more than golf turf, and the arboretum brings together many professions in the entire green industry as well as the golf industry. The arboretum services CDGA member clubs and green industry associations, including nurseries, landscapers and the like.

Many generous individuals have made the building and development of the Sunshine Course possible. Special recognition goes to Brent Wadsworth, I*Mag*Jen Charities, Inc. and the Jemsek family for their appreciation of our Foundation's mission and their dedication to the future of golf.

Brent Wadsworth and the Wadsworth Construction Company donated their time and energy to build the Sunshine Course in May of 2002. Additionally, Brent began the Wadsworth Endowment Fund to promote course research. Now, the Wadsworth Endowment Fund will ensure the future success of course research, programs and operations in the years to come.

The Sunshine Through Golf Foundation would also like to thank the individual donors and corporate partners for the support and donations they continue to provide to the Foundation. Such contributions allow the Foundation to bring the game of golf to more individuals in the area that would not otherwise be able to experience the game.

Sixty years ago, back in 1944, our Foundation was bringing the attributes of golf to disabled veterans returning from World War II by building short courses at many veterans hospitals.

Today, the Sunshine Through Golf Foundation maintains that tradition with the Three-Hole Sunshine Course and I*Mag*Jen Clubhouse.

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A New Beginning

Sixty Year-Old Foundation Gets New Look

With the dedication of the Three-Hole Sunshine Course, the Foundation celebrated a dream realized, opened an exciting new chapter in its 60-year history and unveiled its new name: the Sunshine Through Golf Foundation. The dedication on Sunday, June 6, 2004 signified a new beginning for the Foundation and the completion of the Midwest Golf House project.

During the Foundation's post World War II efforts, it was known as the Chicago District Golf Charities. In 1979, it was renamed the Chicago District Golf Foundation, and in 1992 the name became the CDGA Foundation.

The CDGA Foundation started the Sunshine Through Golf program. As part of this year's new beginning, at 60 years old, it takes on the new name, Sunshine Through Golf Foundation.

"Over the past five years, the Foundation has become best known by the Sunshine Through Golf program," said CDGA exec-

utive director, Robert Markionni. "The name Sunshine Through Golf Foundation better fits the efforts of the foundation today and looking forward."

The new name came with a new logo, but the programs and events the Foundation sponsors each year will continue. The opening of the Three-Hole Sunshine Course at Midwest Golf House has allowed the Foundation to expand its programs and camps this year.

Development of Midwest Golf House began with a dream brought on by the CDGA Board of Directors. Through the \$7.2 million Sunshine Through Golf

Capital Campaign that began in January of 2000 and the generosity of hundreds of donors, that dream is now a reality.

The Sunshine Course features three par-3 holes totaling 500 yards, a 12,000 square-foot chipping and putting green and the I*Mag*Jen Clubhouse. The course offers three distinct services including providing play to our Foundation's Sunshine Through Golf program, turfgrass research and an arboretum.

The Foundation's "Sunshine Through Golf" program has grown from one clinic with 10 participants at its inception in 1999 to 50 clinics and 700 participants this season. On June 6, the Foundation opened the gates of the Sunshine Course to its 700 'members.'

"Since the Sunshine Through Golf program started, the clinics have been held at golf properties all across the Chicago District," said Todd Alfred director of foundation operations. "The Sunshine Course provides a 'home course' to the Sunshine Through Golf children and adults and participants of allied golf associations."

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SUNSHINE AWARDED TO LASALLE BANK

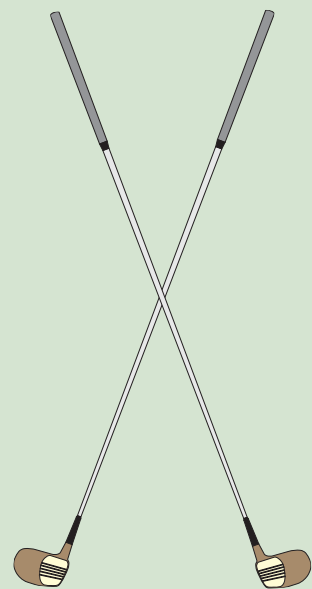
